The Reasons and Procedures behind the search for a new Music Director

To all members of the Murray Symphony,

We would like to inform every one of the procedures for replacing Julie as our Music Director. The Murray Symphony is a 501c3 organization.

501(c)(3) organizations are non-profit organizations, established around a mission. Most people are familiar with 501(c)(3) organizations existing as churches and charities, but they also include private foundations. As long as they operate to support their mission, they receive favorable tax treatments, such as avoiding federal income and unemployment taxes. -- Investopedia

It also helps us when we apply for grants. This means, that we can raise funds as needed and they can be deducted by those who donate as a charitable donation.

For this reason, we must follow the bylaws that have been written to replace our Director. Yes, it is important. There is a copy of the policies and procedures including the bylaws, attached to this email.

The board will select a number of eligible candidates who apply through the portal on the website and fit the requirements. Then the entire organization will vote to determine the final selection of music director. The director will then be elected by rank choice voting with a 2/3 vote of the whole group at our meeting in May.

We are in the process of advertising the opening and publicizing the requirements of those who are interested. Each will be asked to submit a resume, attend and conduct a rehearsal and the finalists will conduct in the Overture Concert in May. Then the group will vote.

Our bylaws are in the process of being updated to modify wording that includes the music director Emeritus procedure, and also the associate and assistant conductor positions, and so forth. These changes will be available to be reviewed by the group with time for feedback before we vote on them as a group the morning of our October concert.

Practice suggestions from 10/13

Michelle would like everyone to practice the songs she is conducting with a recording at least once during the week and pay attention to other parts besides your own. What else do you hear beyond what you are doing? If you lost your place in your music, could you find it again based on what you hear in another section's part? The other big phrase to remember during practice this time around is 'purposeful dynamic contrast'.

In rehearsal last night **Julie** asked that we all practice the *Bacchanal* with a metronome. We need to play at a more consistent speed. She mentioned that she does not want to cut this piece.
